A "RECIPE" FOR A SUCCESSFUL PRAYER LIFE

hile Great Lent is often looked upon as being a time of increased prayer, it must be pointed out that prayer is ALWAYS an essential element in our spiritual lives. What is prayer? By definition, it is "communion with God." Prayer can take several forms. There are prayers of thanksgiving, prayers of worship & prayers of petition.

The power of prayer cannot be matched by any other force. When the Apostles questioned Christ concerning why they could not cast out a demon that was possessing a young boy, the Lord responded that such things could only be accomplished through PRAYER & FASTING. On another occasion, Jesus had this to say about prayer: "Therefore I say to you, whatever things you ask for when you pray, believe that you will receive them, & you will have them."

There are several key ingredients to a successful prayer life. First, we must pray with FAITH. We must certainly believe that God CAN help us & answer our prayers.

Next, we must pray PERSISTENTLY. How impatient we are with our prayers! We must learn not to give up if our prayers are not answered immediately. Remember the Canaanite woman, who relentlessly pursued the Lord until He granted her request? She would not take "no" for an answer!


Finally, we must pray with HUMILITY. We must never forget that God is our FATHER & we are His CHILDREN. He is the MASTER & we are the SERVANT. Surely, Christ's own example while praying in the Garden of Gethsemane should indelibly mark this in our mind. What were His words? NOT MY WILL, BUT THINE BE DONE! Rest assured that the Lord hears all of our prayers. May this intimate conversation with God be an important part of every day for us.

Epistle to the Hebrews (6.13-20)

Brethren, when God made a promise to Abraham, since he had no one greater by whom to swear, he swore by himself, saying, "Surely I will bless you and multiply you." And thus Abraham, having patiently endured, obtained the promise. Men indeed swear by a greater than themselves, and in all their disputes an oath is final for confirmation. So when God desired to show more convincingly to the heirs of the promise the unchangeable character of his purpose, he interposed with an oath, so that through two unchangeable things, in which it is impossible that God should prove false, we who have fled for refuge might have strong encouragement to seize the hope set before us. We have this as a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul, a hope that enters into the inner shrine behind the curtain, where Jesus has gone as a forerunner on our behalf, having become a high priest for ever after the order of Melchiz'edek.

Gospel according to Mark (9.17-31)

At that time, a man came to Jesus and said to him, "Teacher, I brought my son to you, for he has a dumb spirit; and wherever it seizes him, it dashes him down; and he foams and grinds his teeth and becomes rigid; and I asked your disciples to cast it out, and they were not able." And he answered them, "O faithless generation, how long am I to be with you? How long am I to bear with you? Bring him to me." And they brought the boy to him; and when the spirit saw him, immediately it convulsed the boy, and he fell on the ground and rolled about, foaming at the mouth. And Jesus asked his father, "How long has he had this?" And he said, "From childhood. And it has often cast him into the fire and into the water, to destroy him; but if you can do anything, have pity on us and help us." And Jesus said to him, "If you can! All things are possible to him who believes." Immediately the father of the child cried out and said, "I believe Lord; help me in my unbelief!" And when Jesus saw that a crowd came running together, he rebuked the unclean spirit, saying to it, "You dumb and deaf spirit, I command you, come out of him, and never enter him again." And after crying out and convulsing him terribly, it came out, and the boy was like a corpse; so that most of them said, "He is dead." But Jesus took him by the hand and lifted him up, and he arose. And when he had entered the house, his disciples asked him privately, "Why could we not cast it out?" And he said to them, "This kind cannot be driven out by anything but prayer and fasting." They went on from there and passed through Galilee. And he would not have any one know it; for he was teaching his disciples, saying to them, "The Son of man will be delivered into the hands of men, and they will kill him; and when he is killed, after three days he will rise."

Receiving Holy Communion

Orthodox Christians who have prepared spiritually are invited to come forward "with the fear of God, with faith, and with love" to receive Holy Communion.

Non-Orthodox Christians may receive the blessed bread (antidoron) offered at the conclusion of the service, but not Holy Communion. They may come up to receive a blessing during Holy Communion if they wish.

Preparation for Holy Communion includes confession of sins (even of sinful thoughts) and repentance, making peace with those around us, forgiving those who hurt us, asking for forgiveness from those we have hurt, and prayer. There is a special set of prayers called "Preparation for Holy Communion" to help prepare.

If you have further questions regarding the proper preparation for Holy Communion, please speak with Fr. Panayiotis.
