"I DO NOT KNOW THE MAN"

f all of the Apostles, Peter was undoubtedly the most impulsive and boisterous. When our Lord walked across the Sea of Galilee, it was Peter who wanted to join Him. When Jesus questioned the Twelve, inquiring Who they thought He was, it was Peter who boldly proclaimed his belief that He was ". . . the Christ, the Son of the Living God." It is no surprise, therefore to read in the Gospels that when our Lord addressed His followers at the Mystical Supper and predicted that they would all soon abandon Him, Peter loudly protested that even if threatened with death, he would remain loyal to His Master.

As we progress through Lent, we will find that Christ's words were true. After Jesus was arrested, Peter had several opportunities to prove his faithfulness. With the unfolding of Christ's trial before Pilate, we witness his cowardly denial -- not once, but three times -- of even knowing Him! As a cock crowed in the distance, Peter remembered Christ's words, and he wept bitterly. It is no wonder that after our Lord's Resurrection, He poses the question "Do you love Me?" to Peter three times as a reminder of how he fell short of what was expected of him.


There is a great lesson here for all of us to learn. It is relatively easy to be a loyal follower of Christ when everything is going well in our lives. The difficulty in living a Christian life comes when our faith is tested, and when our belief in Christ and His teachings force us to take a stand on matters that may not be popular or in accordance with the prevailing attitudes of the times. We must remain firm in our faith. Our Lord is not looking for "fair weather followers." Indeed, only those who willingly would give their lives for Him will ever see the Kingdom of Heaven.

Epistle to the Hebrews (9.11-14)

Brethren, when Christ appeared as a high priest of the good things that have come, then through the greater and more perfect tent (not made with hands, that is, not of this creation) he entered once for all into the Holy Place, taking not the blood of goats and calves but his own blood, thus securing an eternal redemption. For if the sprinkling of defiled persons with the blood of goats and bulls and with the ashes of a heifer sanctifies for the purification of the flesh, how much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without blemish to God, purify your conscience from dead works to serve the living God.

Gospel according to Mark (10.32-45)

In those days, Jesus and His disciples were on the road, going up to Jerusalem, and Jesus was walking ahead of them; and they were amazed, and those who followed were afraid. And taking the twelve again, he began to tell them what was to happen to him, saying, "Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem; and the Son of man will be delivered to the chief priests and the scribes, and they will condemn him to death, and deliver him to the Gentiles; and they will mock him, and spit upon him, and scourge him, and kill him; and after three days he will rise." And James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to him, and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." And he said to them, "What do you want me to do for you?" And they said to him, "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory." But Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or to be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?" And they said to him, "We are able." And Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared." And when the ten heard it, they began to be indignant at James and John. And Jesus called them to him and said to them, "You know that those who are supposed to rule over the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great men exercise authority over them. But it shall not be so among you; but whoever would be great among you must be your servant, and whoever would be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of man also came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."







Receiving Holy Communion

Orthodox Christians who have prepared spiritually are invited to come forward "with the fear of God, with faith, and with love" to receive Holy Communion.

Non-Orthodox Christians may receive the blessed bread (antidoron) offered at the conclusion of the service, but not Holy Communion. They may come up to receive a blessing during Holy Communion if they wish.

Preparation for Holy Communion includes confession of sins (even of sinful thoughts) and repentance, making peace with those around us, forgiving those who hurt us, asking for forgiveness from those we have hurt, and prayer. There is a special set of prayers called "Preparation for Holy Communion" to help prepare.
